Message from Prof. Walter Popp:

It is now over 15 years ago that the Mongolian Emergency Service Hospital Hygiene Project (MeshHp) started working in Mongolia. In that time, we have seen major improvements in hospital hygiene, but a lot still needs to be done. Dr Gantumur was one of our first contacts and is still our main contact in Mongolia. She spent many years in Germany, speaks excellent German and

is very reliable. She is also a fixed point of contact for us — unlike in the public sector, where directors and other heads change all the time. The MeshHp project was the starting point for Dr Gantumur to found MedClean and import German products for hospital hygiene. And it's been a tremendous success story!

I wish Dr Gantumur and MedClean all the best and would like to thank Dr. Weigert for supporting us in Germany and Mongolia over the years.

Mongolia's Healthcare System: Growing Needs, Growing Standards

Mongolia is a vast country with only 3.5 million inhabitants. Over half of the population lives in the capital city, Ulaanbaatar. In recent years, rising living standards and rapid economic development – particularly in urban centres – have driven public expectations on the healthcare system and hygiene standards. Life expectancy has steadily increased as a result.

The country operates a **two-tiered health-care system** consisting of primary care and specialised services. Healthcare delivery is structured across **three levels of care** – primary, secondary, and tertiary – and administered within two jurisdictions: the capital and the provinces:

- Primary care is provided through urban health clinics and rural family practices, with free access to basic services for both urban and rural residents.
- Secondary care focuses on district hospitals, serving the rural population. Some of these facilities are large in size but lack the medical equipment needed to perform more complex procedures. The state covers about 90% of the associated healthcare costs.

 Tertiary care includes all major hospitals and other institutions specialising in areas such as oncology, infectious diseases and maternity care. Most of these specialised institutions are located in Ulaanbaatar.

Overall, Mongolia has more than 4,500 registered healthcare facilities. The system offers approximately 30,000 hospital beds, 75% of which are in public institutions. The country has 63,000 healthcare professionals.

Medclean LLC – Elevating Hospital Hygiene Standards in Mongolia

Medclean LLC is a Mongolian company founded in 2013 with a clear mission: to raise hospital hygiene standards across the country. The company imports and distributes high-quality disinfection products exclusively from Germany, addressing a critical need in the local healthcare sector.





Medclean has grown significantly over the past decade. Today, more than **2,500** hospitals, clinics and medical practices across Mongolia trust the company's expertise and product range. The demand for Western hygiene products – particularly those made in Germany – continues to grow, reflecting the strong reputation that German products hold in Mongolia.

Medclean offers a comprehensive portfolio, including cleaning and disinfection agents, indicators and rapid tests for Infection Prevention and Control (IPC), medical devices, particularly sterilisation equipment and IPC training, consultancy and capacity-building.

But Medclean's contribution extends beyond logistics and supply. The company actively supports infection control research, supervising bachelor's and master's theses in partnership with the Mongolian University of Medical Sciences and its Department of Microbiology. Furthermore, Medclean has played a key advisory role in helping the Mongolian Ministry of Health develop and introduce its national list of approved disinfectants.

Driving hospital hygiene in Mongolia

Medclean's founder and managing director, **Dr Gantumur Tsagaan**, earned her PhD in 1999 from the Ludwig Maximilian University (LMU) in Munich and spent over a decade conducting research at the Max Planck Institute of Biochemistry in Martinsried. In 2007, she returned to Mongolia and worked in various roles within the national healthcare system, including public education initiatives for HIV and tuberculosis under the Global Fund.

During this time, she observed alarming deficiencies in hospital hygiene. Determined to change this, she teamed up with Prof. Walter Popp to co-found the First National Forum on "Infection Prevention and Control" in Ulaanbaatar in 2013 – with over 170 doctors, hygienists, epidemiologists and representatives from the Ministry of Health and other stakeholders from both national and international organisations.

This laid the foundation for what has since become a sustained effort: annual conferences, seminars and on-site consultations

dedicated to improving hygiene practices in Mongolian healthcare facilities.

The impact has been profound

"Ten years ago, hospital hygiene was virtually nonexistent," recalls Prof. Popp. "Hand hygiene consisted of washing with a bar of soap and drying with cloth towels. There were no hand disinfectants, and surface disinfection was practically unheard of. Surgical instruments were rarely processed according to standards."

Today, the situation is vastly improved. Thanks in large part to the advocacy and outreach led by Dr Tsagaan, most hospitals in Mongolia are now equipped with liquid soap, proper hand disinfectants and paper towel dispensers at every sink.

Surgical instruments are not only cleaned, but are also increasingly disinfected and sterilised using modern equipment.

MeshHp: strengthening local hygiene infrastructure

Launched in 2010 as part of an initiative run by the Ministries of Health of Mongolia and Germany, the Mongolian Emergency Service Hospital Hygiene Project (MeshHp) is a bilateral effort to improve hygiene practices in healthcare facilities and emergency services in Ulaanbaatar. Dr Tsagaan represents Mongolia in the German—Mongolian partnership, regularly participating in delegations and site visits. She acts as a scientific advisor, trainer, local implementer and institutional connector, ensuring that MeshHp's goals are effectively integrated into the Mongolian healthcare system.

MeshHp has already achieved significant, measurable improvements in infection control practices, transforming hospital hygiene standards in Mongolia and establishing a replicable model for national adoption. The project forms part of the bilateral health cooperation between the Ministries of Health of Mongolia and Germany, marking a milestone in the ongoing effort to strengthen healthcare structures and ensure safe, hygienic care for all. On 26 May 2025, the cooperation was extended for another five years.
